

## **MSc Biomedical Sciences**

Once all the course components of your programme have been satisfactorily completed, you can apply for the diploma using the following procedure:

- About five weeks before the date of the examination, make sure you have an approved combination of subjects. For the Master's programmes in Biomedical Sciences, approval is given by the [Master's co-ordinator](#), Renate van Belle. You can obtain a list of your results from the programme secretariat (C 118, W&N-building). At this point some results may still be missing.
- **At least two weeks before the date of the examination, you need to apply for your diploma at the programme secretariat.** You may only submit an application for the programme for which you are *actually registered*. If you are still registered as a Bachelor's or pre-Master's student, you can not yet apply for your Master's examination.
- **The application has to be accompanied by:**
  - written approval of your combination of subjects
  - filled out application form (to be found at the [website](#))
  - result of your most recent assessment, assuming one was made
  - copy of your passport
  - evaluation form (to be found at [website](#))

- Once you have successfully completed your programme of study, you can submit a deregistration request via [www.studielink.nl](http://www.studielink.nl). After having received this request via Studielink the student administration office will send you a letter confirming your deregistration date. Deregistration will be effective the month following the month of your examination date (except for the months July and August). Your graduation ceremony therefore takes place at a later date than your examination date and de-registration.
- If you leave the Netherlands while still waiting for your final results, please make sure you apply for your diploma before leaving.
- Graduations take place five times a year in principle. For a detailed list of graduation dates and corresponding deadlines, please refer to the timetables below:
